## Fr. Tim Away on Extended Holiday...

As part of the extended holidays given to me when I celebrated my 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ordination to Priesthood, I will be leaving Sunday evening for one months' vacation. I will be travelling to Argentina for five days before embarking on a 22-day Antarctica Cruise with Holland America Lines where I will act as priest chaplain offering daily mass for those on board and for the staff. Until my return on Tuesday, February 25, I entrust the administration of the parish to our capable associate pastor, Fr. Mauricio Sanjines.

He will be assisted each weekend by one of our familiar weekend homilists, Fathers Bill Burns, Edwin Gonsalves and Scott Birchall. Fr. Martin Pereira will offer mass each Thursday morning during my absence.

## Little Rock Bible Study – The Gospel of Matthew begins on Thursday, January 30...

This year (Year A in the liturgical cycle) we primarily read the Gospel of Matthew at Sunday mass. This gospel provides a bridge from the Jewish world awaiting a Messiah to the emerging Christian world of Jesus and his followers. This Gospel introduces us to Jesus as the Master Teacher whose words of instruction are captured in large teaching sections. The first five lessons of the series take us from the birth of Jesus through much of his public teaching life, to the first prediction of his passion. This second part of the study reveals a growing tension as Jesus ministers around Jerusalem, is arrested, is crucified, and rises to new life. Revealed as Emmanuel (God with us) at the start of the Gospel, Jesus will promise his continuing presence as the disciples are commissioned at the close of the Gospel.

This is an excellent introduction to bible study for those who have not yet attended one of our Little Rock Bible Studies! We begin this ten-week Thursday evening bible study on Thursday, January 30 at 7:00 p.m. in the parish hall...registration is \$30 per participant. All are welcome!
